WHAT The remaining vestige of what used to be a large and thriving bakery in Venice, Pioneer is now a smaller Montana bakeshop that still makes the best San Francisco-style sourdough bread in town. The cakes and pastries are fine but unremarkable; come here for the bread, or a good sandwich made on the bread.

WHY For excellent homestyle sweets: German chocolate cake, banana pudding with vanilla wafers, layer cakes, cupcakes and lemon squares. WHAT This nostalgiadriven bake shop dressed in retro colors turns out sweets that owner Susan Sarich found on her grandmother's recipe cards. WHO Locals stopping by to pick up birthday-party treats and sneak a cupcake on the side. ⑤

WHY The usual faddish cupcakes (red velvet, dark chocolate, vanilla bean) and beautiful whole cakes to order in advance-for true comfort, get the Mom's Birthday Cake, a yellow cake with milk-chocolate frosting that will leapfrog you back to the '50s. WHAT A small and stylish bake shop specializing in cupcakes to go (large or mini) and gorgeously decorated whole cakes.
